## **Regional Services:**

**Regional Emergency Services Coordinator**: Assists the towns and villages in training, equipment coordination and fire prevention and investigation.

**Economic Development**: Provides programs and services to the citizens and businesses of the region focusing on sustainability and community development.

**Fire**: Owns 50% of seven fire trucks in eight towns and villages, owns five Wildland trucks for fire suppression use, owns three water tankers for the region, contributed \$210,569 towards operating expenses for town and village fire departments.

**Rescue**: Contributed 62.22%, \$11,323, of the operating costs for rescue services.
